During our October scheme, children took part in a range of fun autumn activities.

Arts and crafts

There were many creative projects to choose from such as designing and making a clay pot. The children enjoyed returning to this project throughout the week as they were able to experience the different stages of clay making from moulding and drying to painting.

Sports

Tennis was hugely popular, with some children perfecting their skills and playing against staff. Other sports on offer included archery, with children learning how to hold a bow and take aim at a target, and football, with numerous tournaments taking place on the pitch.

Autumn activities

Autumn was celebrated by way of collecting all things that represented the season. The children went on wildlife walks to forage for materials for making a collage, including leaves, branches and feathers. They also used autumn colours to create paintings that were later displayed in the arts and crafts room.

Wellbeing sessions

The Global Learning Team continued a series of wellbeing sessions for the October scheme. Each session began with a thinking circle, practising listening skills, sharing the changes they see in the season and their favourite things. After lots of rain, the sun came out and the children explored the lovely wildlife garden at the school. They went on an autumn hunt and looked for squirrels and more! It was an oportunity to work in teams and explore the space with curiosity and enthusiasm.

Cooking

Cooking sessions were held throughout the week, with children making carrot cakes, blueberry muffins, apple crumble and sweet potato muffins.

Those in the teen space participated in Jamie Oliver's Ministry of Food cooking workshop delivered by our very own Jamie Oliver trained parent practitioners. The children learnt various cooking skills and made fajitas. For some, it was their first experience cooking and they thoroughly enjoyed using all the utensils and tasting their fajitas, which they later took home.


