Treatment for cockroaches

Phone 020 7364 5007, Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm, and we will make an appointment to visit you.

On the visit, we will survey your home to find the extent and location of the problem. We may lay monitoring traps to confirm which type of pest it is.

Depending on what we find, we will lay a gel-based poison bait and may also spray the affected areas.

We will make any follow-up appointments needed to make sure the home is clear of cockroaches – this usually requires two further visits about four weeks apart.

Dealing with cockroaches yourself

If you decide not to use our service or want to take action before your appointment, there are alternatives:

- You can buy specialist insecticides for crawling insects from supermarkets and hardware stores
- However, we recommend seeking professional advice and treatment.
- Please note that if you are aware of cockroaches in the property it is not acceptable to do nothing, you MUST either treat yourself, or use a Pest Control company to treat for you.

Preventing cockroaches coming into your home

- Take care when buying used furniture or electrical appliances, in case cockroaches are concealed inside.
