

The LCF will continue to liaise with other community groups and TRA's offering Associate Membership to these groups. The LCF was a significant lobby group to reopen the Limehouse Youth Centre, under a contract with New City Gateway, and continues to monitor the activities of the operator, who is also represented on the LCF.		
Economic well-being		The LCF will continue to promote local businesses and employers; local businesses will be offered Associate Memberships so that the views of businesses within Limehouse are represented. The LCF will work to support economical growth within Limehouse and lobby to insure that developments within Limehouse are beneficial to the community.		
Environmental well- bring		The LCF will continue to monitor and work with local groups, the local authority, as well as national organizations to insure that Limehouse meets or exceeds environmental standards. Due to the nature of Limehouse the LCF has for over seven years established a positive relationship with both British Waterways Marian Leasing and the Canal and River Trust (formerly British Waterways), and counts the Managing Directors as Associate Members.

The LCF will exchange liaison membership to any local community group, the LCF has already established a relationship with the Ward Panel, the Limehouse Berth Holders Association, and was represented on both LAP 4 and LAP 7 panels.

Additionally, the LCF envisions close relationships with bordering groups and NPF's; the LCF has already established partnerships with the SaveKEMP group, the Friends of St Katherine's Dock group, Mile End Residents Association, Limehouse Berth Holders Association, New City Gateway the Local SNT Ward Panel, Wapping Bangladeshi Association and the East End Waterways group.

The LCF was established over seven years ago and has met regularly during that time, at lease four times per year and since 2010 bi-monthly. The LCF is made up of representatives from estates, developments and businesses within the Limehouse area. By utilising this network we can reach out and engage with 4500 of the 9000 registered voters in the Limehouse Ward.

Why is the boundary of the Neighbourhood Planning Area considered to be appropriate?

How does the boundary taken into account the physical, economic and social characteristics of the area?

Yes, we believe so, the area is defined to the north by Commercial Road, to the south by the river Thames, both are significant geographical boundaries; to the west by Butcher's Row, (the Limehouse Link being a significant buffer) to the east by West India Dock Road / Westferry Road – but incorporating Garford Street.

It should be noted that a few of the buildings on the north side of Commercial Road are represented on the LCF, namely the Mission and Tequila Wharf, and they perhaps sit better within the economic and social character of the LCF then they do with the area north of Commercial Road. If so directed / desired the LCF would consider adoption of this area.
