Clear central government agenda

- Putting People First (December 2007) set out a "shared vision and commitment to the transformation of Adult Social Care".
- "People who use social care services and their families will increasingly shape and commission their own services"
- "The state and statutory agencies will have a different not lesser role

 more active and enabling, less controlling".







- Transforming Social Care (January 2008) provided further details on the significant resources being made available to councils to transform social care.
- The delivery of personal budgets is to be an essential part of the overall agenda.
- This is not new first introduced in 1998 under the Independent Living Fund
- Community Care, Services for Carer's and Children's Services (Direct Payments) regulations 2003

The Budget and our spend

Total Personal Care Budget = £14,618,000

Traditional Direct Payments £556,000

People with Disabilities £3,057,882

Older People £2,630,724

Total = £6,244,606 (42%)







The ways to control a Cash Personal Budget...

- Cash budget controlled by an individual
- Taking the money as a direct payment
- Using an independent living trust
- Using a broker
- Using a care manager









Mrs Jackson

Following a stroke, Mrs Jackson found that direct payments helped her to take control of her care.

"When I had a stroke four years ago I was provided with home care from Tower Hamlets Social Care services to help me. For two years care workers were sent to help with washing, dressing, cleaning and shopping. I didn't have a regular care worker, I had many different ones; this meant explaining over and over again the tasks that I needed doing







At a review I was told about direct payments. "I was amazed that you could become an employer and choose your own care worker".

I have been receiving direct payments from the council for two years now, and have been delighted with the service. I found a care worker to employ by chance after befriending her sister in a supermarket. I was dreading who I would have next, so I feel really lucky to have found her.
