## What is Safeguarding?

- Safeguarding is <u>everybody's business</u>
- As providers need to be aware of 'adults at risk '
- Care Act includes more abuse types
- Central to the Act is the 6 principles
- Making Safeguarding <u>Personal</u>
- Outcome focussed



### Abuse types



- Physical
- Sexual
- Emotional/Psychological
- Discriminatory
- Organisational (institutional)
- Neglect (acts of omission)
- Financial material
- Self neglect \*
- Modern slavery\*
- FGM (female genital mutilation)\*
- Hate crime\*
- Domestic violence \*









# The 6 principles

- Empowerment
- Partnership
- Prevention
- Protection
- Proportionality
- Accountability





## The Safeguarding Adults Board

- Multi agency around the table improves partnership working
- Learning through SAR's cascaded across agencies – improve practice/reduce harm/prevent reoccurring
- Promotes joined up responses to incidents
- Reduces blame culture
