

A Guide to the Early Help Offer

This Guide provides information on the early help offer and other resources that you may want to access.

What is Early Help?

- Early Help is our approach to providing support to children, young people and their families when problems have emerged but do not yet meet the threshold for statutory intervention.
- Early Help is delivered through:
 - Universal services, accessed, for example, in Children's Centres, early years settings and schools; and targeted services which require a multi-agency intervention such as the Core Early Help Offer
 - Interventions and support that contribute to early help such as parenting support and the array of Voluntary Sector Services including those which support prospective parents from conception.
- Through prompt and targeted interventions issues and problems can be prevented from becoming acute and chronic.

What is the Core Early Help offer?

The Early Help core offer includes the Early Help Hub and services and teams that deliver more complex interventions which require a multi-agency response. The core Early Help Offer is delivered in a number of different settings by skilled workers:

Schools Social Work Team	School age children	<p>Age: Up to age 18</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This is a traded service provided to schools only; available only to those who buy into the service • A team of Social Workers • Offers preventative and targeted interventions with hard to engage families with school age children. • Offer one-to-one casework • Support to schools with Early Help Assessments

Support for Learning Service	Children and young people	<p>Age: 0 up to age 25 if the young person has SEND</p> <p>The Support for Learning Service is a team of specialist teachers. We help to ensure that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • children and young people with SEND can access their education; • supporting schools to be inclusive for all learners. <p>We work in partnership with colleagues from different services, so that children can best access their every day school life.
