

New Family Science Lab workshop for schools

The Parental Engagement Team have been adding to their offer of curriculum-based learning sessions for schools with a new science-based workshop – the Family Science Lab.

The workshop provides insight into science learning in the Early Years and Key Stage 1 and the chance for parents to help their children to develop key scientific skills such as observation, prediction, and experimentation.

Families from **St Peter's London Docks Church of England Primary School** were the first to participate, with their classroom being turned into a science lab.

Parents worked alongside the children on experiments that demonstrated how materials can change their properties based on how they are manipulated through bending, twisting, squeezing or squashing.

Careers information and advice

Young WorkPath is a council service that works with young people aged 13 to 19, or up to age 25 if they have a special educational need or a disability (SEND).

It provides careers information, advice and guidance about the options and next steps available to help young people reach their goals.

Young Workpath continues to support young people during A-level, BTEC, T level and GCSE results days. The team of advisers will be available in schools and colleges on the morning of A-level and GCSE results day. Leaflets will also be sent to schools beforehand for students.

Young people can drop into the Young Workpath Centre at Idea Store Watney Market on **Thursday 15 August** and **Thursday 22 August**, **2-4.30pm**. Alternatively, career interviews can also be offered over the phone or via video.

New Post-16 Prospectus published


The latest version of the Tower Hamlets Post-16 Prospectus has just been published. It is written for students who will complete Year 11 this summer.

Volunteering in Your Child's School course

The Volunteering in Your Child's School course can be delivered either as a ten-week Open College Network (OCN) accredited course or as a five-week, non-accredited introductory course.

Delivered by experienced practitioners from the Parental Engagement Team, the course aims to prepare parents for their role as a volunteer by giving them an insight into teaching and learning in school.

Key topics include teaching and learning methods, the national and Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum, communication strategies, professionalism and safeguarding.

Tower Hamlets Parent and Family Support Service Parenting programmes

Parenting programmes are a source of support for all parents and offer an opportunity to share experiences, develop an understanding of child development, build positive relationships and learn to deal with challenging behaviour.

PROGRAMME	ELIGIBILITY	INFORMATION
Early Repair	All fathers and male carers	Early repair is a brief awareness two-day group programme for fathers identified as using abuse (physical and/or emotional and/or coercive control). It is for fathers who are assessed as being a lower risk in accordance with the Tower Hamlets risk matrix. Professional referrals only.
Emotional First Aid	All parents	Offers an overview of mental health and wellbeing in relation to parenting. Learn strategies to manage anxieties, identify stress factors, gain a better understanding of ourselves and promote a healthier sense of wellbeing.
Family Transitions	All parents	For parents who have experienced separation or divorce to learn how to co-parent effectively and to learn strategies for how to deal with the loss of their relationship with their ex-partner.
Strengthening Families, Strengthening Communities	2-18 years	Aims to increase parental self-esteem and confidence and reduce child behavioural difficulties.
Speakeasy	5-18 years	For parents to develop the skills and confidence to talk to their children about growing up, relationships and keeping safe. Explores how relationship and sex education (RSE) is taught in schools and the influence on children from media and peers. Four weekly sessions.
Triple P for Baby	0-12 months	To prepare parents for a positive transition into parenthood and the first year with baby promoting sensitive and responsive care.
Triple P Group	2-11 years	For parents who wish to build positive relationships with their child, increase self-confidence and develop their skills and techniques for dealing with difficult behaviour.
Triple P Teen	12-18 years	For parents who wish to build positive relationships with their teens, increase self-confidence and develop their skills to communicate more effectively with their teens.

- Managing fighting and aggression
- Developing good bedtime routines
- Hassle-free mealtimes with children

For parents of children aged 12-18 years

- Coping with teenagers' emotions

In a digital age when children are facing increased online risks, innovative approaches are needed. This is why the new Digital Safety Parent Ambassador programme has been set up. The programme aims to foster a culture of digital responsibility and nurture a generation of informed parents who have the tools to help keep children safe online.

The new ambassadors met for their first training session, delivered by the Parental Engagement Team, at the Town Hall.

The training explored topics such as cyberbullying, online privacy and internet safety,



equipping the ambassadors with the skills needed to support parents at Globe Primary School.

The training gave them a better awareness of online dangers and the confidence to support other parents when tackling these issues head-on. Empowered by the strategies and resources the training provided, the ambassadors are now poised to be advocates for digital safety within the community.

Additional support for parents of children aged 0-2 years

The first 1,001 days of a child's life is such a crucial time in their development. To provide extra support, the Department for Education (DfE) has made funding available to develop or deliver programmes for parents of children aged 0-2 years.

The Parental Engagement Team have successfully received some of this funding to develop and deliver the following programmes:

Get Talking

In this three-part workshop, which was delivered at Marion Richardson's Early Years site and Alice Model Nursery School, parents learned about the importance of communicating with their baby or toddler, even before they can speak.

They discovered playful ways to encourage communication and interaction that are the foundations to early language development.

Get Mark-making


In this workshop, delivered at **Columbia Market Nursery School**, parents learned how mark-making is a crucial phase in their baby's journey towards writing.

They discovered ways they can help their baby or toddler develop the strength in their hands, fingers and wrists required for mark-making that will eventually help when they begin to explore letter formation.

Building better relationships: free online support for parents

Children and families safeguarding services merge

The Early Help Hub and Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) have merged to create one integrated team - the Multi-Agency Support Team.

This new team of professionals will be responsible for all aspects of safeguarding children and family support in Tower Hamlets.

The merger has happened in response to the recommendations from the Greater London Authority peer review that took place in 2022. The team will ensure that children, young people and their families receive the right

service at the right time, preventing confusion and making it easier to access services.

They are now operating from the Town Hall in Whitechapel and a new pathway for referrals has been developed. The new single pathway has replaced the two previous pathways for the Early Help Hub and MASH. This will ensure a more joined-up approach between services.

Restorative Practice: Learn more about the 'Better Together' framework


In 2022, the Supporting Families Division (which includes the Early Help Service, Youth Justice and Young People's Service and Children's Social Care) launched the 'Better Together' framework. This sets out how staff in the division work with children, their carers and people involved in the network of support. The framework is based on restorative practice as well as drawing on some systemic and trauma Informed ideas.

The framework's C-Change approach:

- Connect
- Be Curious
- Build a Community around the child
- Co-produce plans with those affected by them
- Collaborate to bring about change
- Check back to see if it's making a difference

The framework's commitments

- Be open and honest
- Listen to understand
- Value families' experiences
- Work to prevent harm and repair damage
- Empower people with support

Evidence-based therapy strengthens family relationships

Functional Family Therapy is an evidence-based, therapeutic intervention for the whole family. It is delivered in families' homes by skilled therapists. It mainly focuses on children aged 10-17 years who face harm outside the home.

The aim is to strengthen relationships and reduce the impact of the harm of risky behaviour on the family.

Functional Family Therapy works

- With the whole-family for up to five months
- Using highly qualified clinicians
- Using a quality assured model and clinical oversight
- With a relational focus. building on strengths in the family.

The Royal Society of Public Health (RSPH) help people lead healthier lives.

How to keep your family safe from measles

Measles cases are on the rise in London. Measles is highly contagious and can cause serious illnesses, such as pneumonia, meningitis, and in extreme cases, blindness or death. One in five children with measles requires hospital treatment. Both children and adults can be infected

Know the symptoms

Measles usually begins with cold-like symptoms, followed by a rash that begins on the head and face and moves down towards the feet:

- On dark skin, the rash may be harder to see and may appear purple or look darker than the surrounding skin.
- On white skin, the rash tends to be brown, or
- Small white spots may also appear inside the mouth.

Keep your family safe

The MMR vaccine is the safest and most effective way to protect your family. There are two types of vaccines: MMR VaxPro® contains pork gelatine, Priorix® does not. Both vaccines are available freely on the NHS and you can request Priorix® from your doctor. Side effects are usually mild. If you have questions or concerns, contact your GP.

Vaccination is the best way to protect your child against measles. Are your child's vaccines up-to-date?

Childcare support is expanding. The expansion includes free paid for hours for two, three and four-year-olds to begin with, and eventually spanning to babies from nine months old.

Key dates

From April 2024

Eligible working parents of two-year-olds will be able to access 15 hours per week from the term after their child's second birthday.

From September 2024

Eligible working parents of children aged nine months up to three years will be able to access 15 hours per week (from the term after their eligible birthday).

From September 2025

Eligible working parents of children aged nine months up to three years will be able to access 30 hours per week (from the term after their eligible birthday).




DLR Treasure Hunt

SENCOs are also referred to as SENDCOs (Special Educational Needs and Disability Coordinators) in some schools.

SENDIASS refers to the Special Educational Needs and Disability Information Advice and Support Service.

Parents – references to 'parents' describes any caregiver responsible for the care, protection and upbringing of a child or young person, including foster parents or connected persons, grandparents, siblings or other family members living in Tower Hamlets.

The SENDIASS Annual Report for 2023

The Tower Hamlets and City SEND Information, Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS) is a self-referring service which offers advice, information and support to parents or carers of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) from birth to 25 years old.

It aims to build confidence in parents to be able to be actively involved in their child's education and to participate in the development of local services.

The team works in partnership with parents, schools, voluntary and statutory agencies, as well as young people themselves, to provide a flexible menu of services in order to empower parents and children and young people to play an active and



informed role in their child's education, leading to higher achievement for all children. The service recently published its Annual Report for 2023.

families a month on average received casework service interventions ranging from one month to over a year

of the children and young people, whose parents/carers contacted the service had a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010)




