Holiday Childcare Scheme February Half Term 2022 - Zoo's



The February Half Term Scheme took place at St Mary and St Michael School. This school has a large outdoor area with different play areas and is a bright and welcoming space.

Children took part in a range of activities throughout the week based on the theme 'We love Zoos' in the main scheme and 'Dear Zoos' in the Early Years scheme.

Activities involved the children using their own creativity, increasing their fitness levels, developing sports skills and baking delicious and nutritious treats. Read about our themed activities below:

In arts and crafts, clay modelling was very popular. Children enjoyed manipulating clay to create models of their favourite animals. They used their hands and plastic tools to cut, mould, scrape and shape the clay. Once their clay models were dry, they used a variety of bright colours

to paint their creations. Children in the main scheme also built a whole city made of Lego.

In fitness, children had the opportunity to go bike riding, access outdoor play equipment, play musical chairs, build giant floor puzzles and many other fun activities to help them enjoy getting moving and having fun together, both indoors and outside.

In sport skills, children enjoyed archery, playing mini golf and taking part in a range of ball games and other sports that help to develop coordination and teambuilding skills.

In cooking, the children cooked a variety of savoury and non-savoury

Well done! (GQ)	The activities are a guide to the programme available. Some changes may occur due to weather, resources and staffing however we do our best to keep to the programme. We aim to inform all parents/carers of any incident that may occur during the scheme and thank you for your feedback that staff are proactive, and you feel informed.
There should be the option to change days or offer days when holiday plan changes. For example, if plans have changed and my daughter is going to visit her dad. I would love to be able to offer her place to another family in need rather than losing the place (CL)	The Magic Booking app is open throughout the scheme and parents/carers can book if any spaces are available. We are aware that some parent's plans may change, however we have to offer an equal application to everyone who wants to use the service.
Not much information about the activities (GM)	Our activity timetable, videos of the scheme and our newsletters are available on our website. We also display the activity plan in the main entrance with other important information that might be beneficial to parents/carers.
My child would like to go on trips out (HF)	We are planning to take children on more trips from the Easter scheme, now that restrictions are removed, and the weather is improving.
My 4 yr. old doesn't tell us what he's done, and the carers don't say anything at pickup time either. But he is happy and wants to go back the next day. (SM)	Our aim is to ensure that all the children take home anything they have worked on during the scheme so parents can see what the children have been doing. Photos are also included in the scheme newsletter, and we will be developing a display board of children's work where they will be able to add things that they wish to take home at the end of the scheme. We are happy that your child really enjoys the scheme and wants to return!
