The purpose of this new, annual return is to collect additional information on local authorities' discharge of their duties under the homelessness legislation, in compliance with Cabinet Office "Policy Appraisal for Equal Treatment" guidelines. This will provide a useful supplement to the quarterly data already collected on form P1E, summary details of which are published by the Department in a quarterly *Information Bulletin* (England and regional totals) and annually in *Local Housing Statistics* (individual authority data).

Points to note when completing the return

- Where an entry is zero, please enter "0", rather than leave the cell blank.
- When asked to provide an explanation, please use the notes box (for electronic returns) or on a separate sheet attached to this form (for returns completed on paper).
- **Asylum Seekers:** Please include any cases considered and accommodated under relevant homelessness legislation (ie Housing Acts 1996 (Part VII) or 1985 (Part III)). Where numbers involved are large and precise detail is not readily available, estimates of each sub-category will suffice. **Do not include those cases where responsibility is met under social security legislation (ie Immigration and Analysis Act 1999, National Assistance Act 1948 or the Children Act 1989). This also applies to all other categories of households about whom decisions are taken.**
