- Asylum Seekers: Please only include cases where an asylum claim was lodged prior to 3 April 2000, and which have been considered and accommodated under the homelessness legislation (i.e. Housing Acts 1996 (Part VII) or 1985 (Part III)). Where numbers involved are large and precise detail is not readily available, estimates of each sub-category will suffice. Do <u>not</u> include those cases where Asylum Seekers are being accommodated as a discharge of a duty owed by the Social Services department (e.g. under the Asylum Support (Interim Provisions) Regulations 1999.
