Where numbers involved are large and precise detail is not readily available, estimates of each sub-category will suffice. Do not include those cases where Asylum Seekers are being accommodated as a discharge of a duty owed by the Social Services department (e.g. under the Asylum Support (Interim Provisions) Regulations 1999.
