

Looking for accommodation?

With demand far exceeding the supply for social housing, more and more people are renting privately. Here are some other ways of looking for your own home.

PRIVATE RENTED ACCOMMODATION

ROON

Waiting to be housed through the Council can take a long time as there are not enough homes to house everyone. Private rented accommodation could be the best option if you need somewhere to live and are unlikely to be housed through our housing register. Widening your options to other parts of London, or even outside of London, could help you resolve your housing difficulty sooner.

Types of private rented accommodation

There are different types of accommodation which are available to rent, including the following:

• Self-contained houses or flats

These are properties rented by landlords or letting agencies. You will have your own kitchen and bathroom and have the property to yourself.

HOUSE

Renting as a lodger You rent a room in a landlord's home,

sharing all facilities with the landlord.

Bedsits or rooms You will have your own room but will share facilities such as the kitchen or bathroom with other people.



Useful information



TENANCY DEPOSITS

Most tenancies will be subject to tenancy deposit protection schemes which ensure that deposits paid to landlords are kept safe and that a tenant gets their deposit back at the end of the tenancy as long as there has not been a breach of the tenancy agreement. It is also important that you have a written agreement with your landlord agreeing the condition of the property and its inventory (a list of furniture and removable items). This should help prevent disagreements at the end of the tenancy.

HOUSING BENEFIT

You may be entitled to help with your rent if you are on benefits or on a low income. Housing Benefit is a means-tested benefit (based on financial circumstances) that helps people who are on low incomes.

UNDER 35

If you are single (without dependents), in private rented housing and aged under 35 you will only be entitled to housing benefit at the same rate as you would get for renting a single room in a shared house. This rule does not apply to couples or to single parents under the age of 35.

PERSONAL CONTACTS

Ask family, friends and work colleagues if they know of anyone who has accommodation to rent or someone who is about to give up a room or a flat.

SUPERMARKETS AND SHOPWINDOWS

Accommodation is sometimes advertised in shop windows, newsagents or on display boards in supermarkets.

STUDENTS

If you are at college or university, check whether they have details of accommodation to rent. Talk to a student welfare officer or accommodation officer.

LESBIAN AND GAY

ACCOMMODATION AGENCIES AND LETTING AGENCIES

Accommodation agencies and letting agencies rent rooms, flats and houses on behalf of private landlords. These agencies advertise their properties in newspapers, websites and in their shops.

MUTUAL EXCHANGE

Given the shortage of available homes in Tower Hamlets, for many social housing tenants, mutual exchange may be their best option for moving. A mutual exchange is when two or more tenants who want to move from their current home, swap homes once they have the permission of all landlords involved.

To find a mutual exchange you can register on the website **www.homeswapper.co.uk** This is a national website and free to Tower Hamlets Council tenants.

BUYING YOUR OWN HOME AND SHARED OWNERSHIP

Shared ownership enables you to become a homeowner if you cannot afford to buy a home outright. This scheme allows you to buy a share of a property. You pay a mortgage on the share you own and pay rent on the rest.

You may also be able to buy a new home with the help of an equity loan of up to 20% of the full purchase price using the FirstBuy scheme. The FirstBuy equity loan will be interest-free for the first five years with a charge payable from year six. For more information either about shared ownership or FirstBuy, contact:
