

Locksley D – 17 Proposed New Council Homes

Tower Hamlets Council have embarked on a new build programme to increase the supply of New Council Homes. The proposal to build on this land known as Locksley Site (D) is part of a wider programme being undertaken by the Council.

Tower Hamlets has a severe shortage of affordable homes for rent for local people, with over 18,000 households on its Housing Register. This is a London-wide problem, which the Council is seeking to address through the Mayor's commitment to the delivery of 2,000 new council homes.

The Proposal Includes:

Locksley D:

1. 17 New Homes for Social and Tower Hamlets Living Rent.
2. Improved Surveillance of the Canal Towpath, an area which has been identified as problematic in terms of anti social behaviour.
3. A new visual connection to Canal from Salmon Lane.
4. A new wildlife wall facing 1-12 Parnham St. to accommodate climbing plants, interspersed with Bat Boxes and Bird Boxes which will improve the biodiversity of the area.
5. New allotment planters for use by residents of 1-12 Parnham Street.
6. A new garden for visual amenity and security to 1-12 Parnham Street. and the new Building.
7. Resurfacing and new equipment for existing playground on the estate.
8. New hedgerow and wildflower meadow on land adjoining Ashpark House which will further improve the biodiversity of the area.
9. New flower planting in green area between Rhodeswell Road and the canal.
