### Theaster Gates: A Clay Sermon

Clay and religion are foundational to the artistic practice of the Chicago based artist who has received international acclaim for his community and cultural interventions in Black space, particularly on the South Side of Chicago. As a youth, Gates joined the New Cedar Grove Missionary Baptist Church choir and, subsequently, studied urban planning, theology and ceramics.

A Clay Sermon is an exposition of the significance of clay, its material and spiritual legacies. Bringing together research, ideas, process and production, this exhibition surveys works by Gates across two decades from his early hand-thrown pots to his large-scale Afro-Mingei sculptures. It explores craft, labour, performance and racial identity; the use of clay in building communities of knowledge, its role in colonialism and global trade and the ceremonial and ritual use of ceramics.



Here Gates's transformation of clay
– from geological substance into
utilitarian and artistic material – stands
as a powerful metaphor for his sociallyengaged work and wider artistic practice.
This major solo exhibition of the artist's
clay-based work plays the central role
in an ambitious collaboration between
the Whitechapel Gallery, the Victoria and
Albert Museum (V&A) and Serpentine.

In 1866 Dr Thomas John Barnardo set up his first ragged school. This was a free school for poor children who lived in the Fast End of London. However, it was soon clear to him that although the children could go to school, they had nowhere to live. By 1870 he set up his first children's orphanage and it wasn't long before he began to take in children from very poor families. Some of the poorest children belonged to Black Victorians, and Barnardo's was the first charity to take them in. Come and hear the story of the first Black children in the UK to be placed in



care and fostered. Who were they? What happened to them? How did they come to England? Why were they here in the first place? Hear about some of the children lives.



Hailed as Britain's first black feature film, Pressure (1976) dramatizes the tensions between three generations of a Trinidadian family living in West London's Ladbroke Grove. It tells the story of Tony, the family's younger son who is unemployed, discriminated against and disillusioned. He rebels against his parent's church-going conformity and follows his older brother into the Black Power movement. This hard hitting narrative has been described at "a gritty and dynamic study of a generation in crisis".

Ové has said: "What Pressure tried to do was to portray the experience of the Windrush generation, the kids who came with them and the kids born here."

Babylon is a 1980 British drama film directed by Franco Rosso. Written by Franco Rosso and Martin Stellman (Quadrophenia), and shot by two-time Academy Award winner Chris Menges (The Killing Fields), Babylon is an incendiary portrait of racial tension and police brutality set in Brixton, London. The film, anchored by Dennis Bovell's propulsive score, is partly based on Bovell's false imprisonment for running a Jamaican sound system, Sufferer's Hi Fi, in the mid-70s.



Young Soul Rebels is a 1991 British coming-of-age thriller written by Derek Saldaan McClintock, Isaac Julien and Paul Hallam, and directed by Julien as his first narrative feature film. The film examines the interaction between youth cultural movements during the late 1970s in the UK — namely skinheads, punks, and soulboys — along with the social, political, and cultural tensions between them.

Set the long hot summer of 1977, London was preparing for the Queen's Silver Jubilee celebrations and the temperatures simmered between burgeoning the punk soul and funk scenes. Social and sexual



tensions soared following the murder of a local black gay man.



"How can this amount suffice? Add another lak to it."

This play, based on historical sources, tells the story of how in 1487 the Habshi rule of Bengal began and what happened during the short-lived turbulent years that caused its end in 1494.

The performance includes contextualisation of the period. It looks at how and when the Ethiopians came to Bengal, what roles they played and how some of them rose to power to become sultans of the powerful, large and economically rich territory of the Bengal Sultanate.



In total, there were four sultans from an Ethiopian background that ruled the Bengal Sultanate for nearly seven years.

The short period of Ethiopian or Habshi rule of Bengal (1487-1494) was also very significant, at least, in one major way. It ended the previous Ilyas Shahis that ruled Bengal for about 150 years with a short break and was the longest dynastic rule of the Bengal Sultanate.






