## Update on the use of LIF Funding – Round 1 – 2017 Consultation

30<sup>th</sup> September 2019

## Background

In 2017 we asked you to tell us how £11.1m worth of Local Infrastructure fund (LIF) monies raised from new developments in the borough should be spent. Your responses provided guidance to the Council on your priorities for spending, covering both the types of infrastructure you wish to see supported and a range of specific projects you would like to see delivered.

In response to the 2017 consultation, the Council received 80 project nominations. Your feedback broadly identified that your priorities for spending LIF are similar across the borough, with a focus on:

- Parks and Open Spaces
- Local Connections
- Public Realm

Many of the projects were already planned for delivery by the Council or other bodies and did not require LIF funding, some projects did not fit the legal requirements for spending LIF and some were the responsibility of another body to fund, e.g. TfL. The remaining applicable projects were further assessed to prioritise those that are considered deliverable, good value for money and fit local priorities. An initial assessment of these projects narrowed down the options for allocating LIF. This can be broken down to:

- Part A Projects awarded (awarded LIF monies from the 2017 LIF Public Consultation)
- Part B Priority themes (Priority awarded LIF monies from the 2017 LIF Public Consultation).

## Part A - Projects awarded LIF funding

As a result of the public consultation the Council has been able to successfully allocate funding to a range of your nominated projects, which are now entering feasibility and delivery phases. A range of nominated larger projects require further investigation to understand if they are feasible and how they may be delivered. Where this is the case, the Council has allocated funding to undertake a feasibility study in 2019/20 and ring-fenced money to support delivery in future years.

The table below shows projects suggested through the consultation that have been awarded funding. In total £7.8m has been allocated to public nominated projects. Many of the projects are aimed to be delivered in 2019/20.

## Part B – Priority themes (*awarded LIF monies from the 2017 LIF Public Consultation*).

The Council also recognises the need to ensure that LIF supports the wider priorities identified through the consultation, not only the specific nominated projects. In areas of high growth in particular, there is a need for the Council to support the on-going LIF programme to enhance the local area in ways that match your priorities. To achieve this, the Council needs to ensure there are resilient delivery plans and structures in place to create a pipeline of projects that will deliver to meet your needs.

A total of £2.4m of LIF is allocated towards managing the impacts of housing growth and identifying supporting infrastructure in the areas of high growth. Studies and Plans are being developed using LIF monies to ensure that priorities such as provision or improvements to parks and open spaces, public realm and local connections are addressed and improvement projects are delivered in good time. The following table details this investment:
