- 5. Health facility

Agreed Actions

Site references

 It is agreed that the text relating to each site allocation should refer to the site allocation number. A minor modification has been proposed to insert site reference number for all site allocations before each table (1.1, 1.2 etc.) for clarification and consistency.

PTAL

 It is agreed that the PTAL should reflect the arrival of Crossrail. A minor modification has been proposed as follows:

6a 6b (by 2017 2021*) 6b (by 2031)

Insert at bottom of the page:

*the year has been used due to the arrival of Crossrail at Whitechapel

Outstanding Issues

Health facility

- Barts: the procurement / commissioning of healthcare services is not a matter for the planning regime.
- LBTH: the Infrastructure Delivery Plan identifies the need for the reprovision of an existing sexual health facility at this location.

District heating facility

- Barts: the provision of a district heating facility must only be made if there is a clear mechanism in place that does not place undue burdens on landowners.
- LBTH identified the potential for a district heating facility at Whitechapel in the Whitechapel Masterplan Vision SPD and the Tower Hamlets London Heat Map Study (2011).

Green Spine

- Barts: the proposal has not been properly and clearly justified, it would have a disproportionate effect on landholdings and the delivery mechanism is unclear.
- LBTH: the principle and delivery mechanism of the Green Spine has been set out in the Open Space Strategy, Green Grid Strategy, the Infrastructure Delivery Plan and the Whitechapel Vision Masterplan Supplementary Planning Document. LBTH argues that the scheme can

be delivered based on the existing consented open space as per the map.
