Development Update & Neighbourhood Forum

Dear residents,

Tower Hamlets Council planning department have received a large number of developments proposals for developments along Marsh Wall, Westferry Road, Byng Street and Millharbour. These developments include;

In Blackwall & Cubitt Town ward an additional 9,450 properties are planned. Plus 1,800 new homes are planned to replace the office buildings to the north of East India DLR station.

Three years ago the national census measured 12,500 people living in the ward, so the table suggests another 20,000 people moving to the area in the next 5 to 10 years. In addition there are a number of sites like behind the Hilton hotel, which developers have been interested in, if these sites are built on we could easily add another 4,600 residents.

Any issues you might have today with transport, parking, schools, green spaces etc could worsen by a factor of three. As the Councillor for the area this is clearly one of the most important issues for me to deal with. Not all of the developments listed will end up as big as developers want or even happen but in early September a company based in Dubai bought the development rights to the ASDA supermarket site, which shows how interested developers are in the area.



So what can we do about it?

First Tower Hamlets Council are developing a strategic plan for the area, it is called the South Quay Masterplan. It looks in detail at the 28 development sites along Marsh Wall. They will launch a formal consultation in December but that is only at the end of the process, they have been talking to developers since April. We want to organise a proper community response to the Masterplan, as it will determine issues like schools, GP surgeries, green areas and transport for the whole area.

Boris Johnson, the Mayor of London is concerned that too many tall buildings are being proposed without an overall vision for the area so he is also now involved in the Masterplan as well. Sir Edward Lister, Deputy (London) Mayor for Planning said: "South Quay is enjoying unprecedented interest from developers all of whom want to bring forward their own plans. While we want to see the comprehensive regeneration of the area, what we cannot allow is a situation where planning is granted on a first-come-first-served basis with no overall strategy, as this could eat up valuable space, have a negative impact on the public realm"

Second and most important is that we are setting up a Neighbourhood Planning Forum for the area. In an Act of Parliament called the Localism Act passed in 2011, if 21 or more local people join together, adopt a written constitution and are approved by the Council they can write a local development plan for the area. That plan has to go through a full public consultation at every stage and is then examined by an external expert. If approved it goes to a local referendum where local people get to vote yes or no on whether to adopt the plan. If 50% + of the residents vote yes then it becomes part of the local planning law for the next 15 years. In the plan we can also determine how 25% of any developers money gets spent. This money normally goes straight to Tower Hamlets Council who then decide where to spend the money, most of it in the past has not been spent on the Island.
