It was really great that you and Sophie came to the meeting on Monday - so thank you!
Please pass my thanks on to Sophie.

Following up from our conversation, I can drop the PowerPoint into your 'drop box' but I am not sure how to do that. Is there a link or something you can give me...

The other issue is boundary changes following on from our consultation and, specifically, extending them to contain the Spitalfields City Farm. The issue was raised at both our consultation meetings and elsewhere where many people thought it was highly appropriate to include the Spitalfields City Farm within the bounds of the SNPF. I went to the farm a couple of days ago and spoke to the management there and using a plan marked the boundaries of the farm with the assistance of Mhairi Weir, the manager.

The borders that I would like your views on include the farm as well as the small derelict building (a sort of hut) and empty patch of asphalt that was formerly a playground but has since had the playground equipment relocated to Allen Gardens. It seems sensible for this derelict building and patch of open ground to be areas within the bounds also because they are literally surrounded by the farm and a future forum may want to consider the future of that open patch of asphalt in any policy towards the whole Allen Gardens/Farm zone on the north side of Buxton Street.

I include a map below of the borders I think would be most suitable. Our old boundary at the eastern end of Allen Gardens is in green. What I propose the border be extended to include is in red. The areas owned by Thomas Buxton school and remaining outside our bounds are indicated with blue type.

If you think these boundaries are sensible I can recommend them to the next meeting of the interim steering group on 12 August. If you think a variation is better, please let me know.

As a local stakeholder or representative of a local organisation you have been invited to attend a consultation meeting about the establishment of a *Neighbourhood Planning Forum* in the Spitalfields area.

Since 2011 local communities such as ours have been empowered under the *Localism Act* to set up 'Neighbourhood Planning Forums'. These forums are official bodies legally empowered to create enforceable planning policies of their own in their local areas. In essence a *Neighbourhood Planning Forum* would empower the local communities of Spitalfields to have a far greater say over future planning and development matters. Many Neighbourhood Planning Forums have been successfully established across London; one of the most recent has been in 'East Shoreditch' which is an area similar in many ways to ours around Redchurch Street, the Boundary Estate and Arnold Circus.

In November 2013, a joint committee of members drawn from the Spitalfields Society, the Spitalfields Community Group and the Attlee Youth & Community Centre was formed to work together on an interim basis on an application for 'Forum & Area Designation' to Tower Hamlets Council. Since then we have liaised with government agencies as well as local planning officers and, subsequently, have prepared a draft constitution and a neighbourhood area proposal which we think future planning policies drafted by a Neighbourhood Planning Forum in Spitalfields should cover.

In November 2013, a joint committee of members drawn from the Spitalfields Society, the Spitalfields Community Group and the Attlee Youth & Community Centre was formed to work together on an interim basis on an application for 'Forum & Area Designation' to Tower Hamlets Council. Since then we have liaised with government agencies as well as Tower Hamlets Planning Department. Subsequently, we have prepared a neighbourhood area proposal and draft constitution which we believe will form the basis of a future Neighbourhood Planning Forum in Spitalfields.

As part of the ongoing consultation process on these proposals we are actively seeking the advice, guidance and support (a broad a range- omit?) of as many local organisations and stakeholders as possible. As such, we are inviting almost eighty local organisations and groups based in Spitalfields to a consultative event on 21 July where they can look at the proposed neighbourhood forum constitution and area plan and consider putting their names forward as a prospective forum members.

As a local organisation or stakeholder we therefore hope you can come to the:

Stakeholders Consultation Event at the Attlee Centre (5 Thrawl Street, E1 6RT), on Monday 21 July 2014 from 6.30pm.

We want to apologise for the fact that our proposed meeting is during Ramadan. As volunteers and with a deadline set by the Council (whereby we have to submit our application for 'designation' before 1st September) we really did not have a choice and we appreciate the timing is not ideal. If you really cannot come but are still interested in the initiative please do get in touch with us because we can keep you informed as well as answering any questions which you may have in other ways.

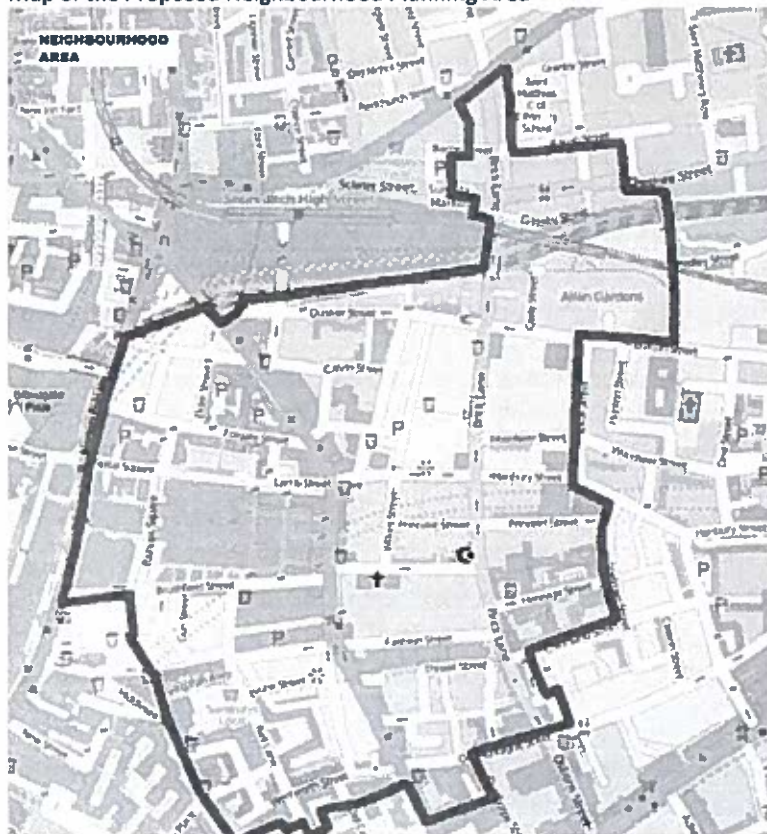

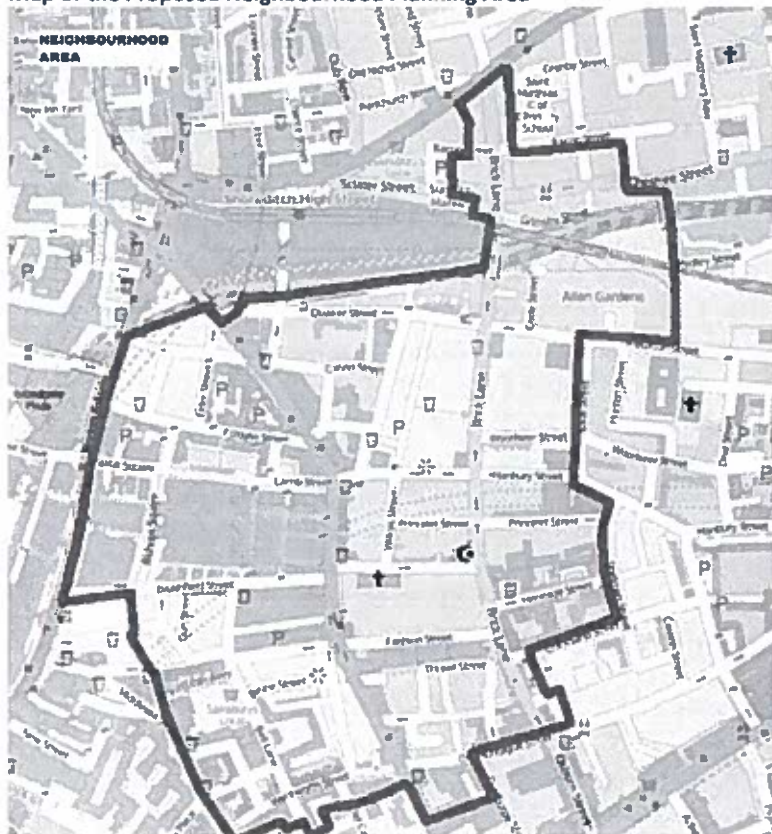

Great to speak to you earlier. Following up from our conversation we have had requests for membership from Tayla Mead, Mia Lewis, Katarina Rabatinova, Emma Nouriel, Alphonso C. Rock, Paul Maynard and yourself.

Jason joined at one of the consultation meetings and we had already accepted him as a member representing the Old Truman Brewery. I note your suggestion that Zeloof LLP and Old Truman Brewery be regarded as separate entities and think this could work so long as everyone at your organisation/s supported that. If this was pursued then you would need to decide which entity it was you were each representing.

All of the above mentioned persons said in their applications that they supported the creation of the forum and the boundaries which would be covered by any resulting neighbourhood plan.

As regards the other persons from your office who have applied to join, earlier I wrote to Jason and explained that it would not be possible for seven or eight people from the same company (or even four from two companies) to all be members.

What has confused the matter since I wrote to Jason is that two additional persons both presumably employed by the Old Truman Brewery named Rudi Khalastchi (rudi@trumanbrewery.com) and Nikki Wilding (nikki@trumanbrewery.com) have made application to join this afternoon but in their applications they have said they objects to the borders of the forum area which contradicts the applications all the other OTB/Zeloof persons made yesterday.

Also, I am wondering if some of the tenants at 91 Brick Lane would benefit from learning a bit more about what a neighbourhood forum is and what it does and – in particular – what its limitations are because there have been several application forms submitted within the space of an hour by OTB tenants (namely Phil Evans from The Complete Works, Simon Crosbie from Mohawk HQ and Jake Hardy from Number Six London) who have each made applications saying they are against the idea of a neighbourhood forum. I have not been able to speak to any of them to find out if I could help but did manage to speak to the administrator who completed the form on behalf of Simon Crosbie who told me that Mr. Crosbie had not seen our website and was not really aware of neighbourhood planning was and led me to believe that some of the tenants had collectively met about it and perhaps had misconceptions about the purpose of the initiative thinking it would “bring about great changes to the area” when in fact it certainly could not.

It would be very useful if perhaps a meeting could be organised with these tenants or perhaps Jason who has been to the consultation meetings could speak to them and see what their concerns about the forum are and this would give me and the other people working on this a chance to provide appropriate information which may assuage any fears or misconceptions they have.

We have received your application for forum membership but note you have said you would not support the creation of a neighbourhood forum. I thought it would be helpful to talk to you about what a neighbourhood forum is and what its limitations are because I think there are some misconceptions circulating at the moment.

Many local organisations have come together to establish a neighbourhood forum in Spitalfields. A full list can be found here: <http://www.spitalfieldsforum.org.uk/forum-members/>

The groups supporting this are diverse and we would very much welcome your involvement.

Neighbourhood Forums are there to draft neighbourhood plans. So far across the UK only 75 neighbourhood plans have been drafted and so far on six have been approved in a public referendum. In the absence of a plan they are also a valuable tool for local business and residents to meet and share ideas and attempt to find mutually agreeable solutions to shared local problems.

Some general principles for Neighbourhood Plans

What Neighbourhood Plans can and cannot contain.

While a Neighbourhood Plan is flexible to some extent in terms of what can be included, you cannot put whatever you like in it. A Neighbourhood Plan cannot conflict with European Union (EU) requirements or the Human Rights Act 1998. Crucially, it must also conform generally with the strategic policies in the Local Plan prepared by your local planning authority.

What a Neighbourhood Plan can do:

- Decide where and what type of development should happen in the neighbourhood
- Promote more development than is set out in the Local Plan
- Include policies, for example regarding design standards, that take precedence over existing policies in the Local Plan for the neighbourhood u2013 provided the Neighbourhood Plan policies do not conflict with the strategic policies in the Local Plan.

What a Neighbourhood Plan cannot do:

- Conflict with the strategic policies in the Local Plan prepared by the local planning authority
- Be used to prevent development that is included in the Local Plan
- Be prepared by a body other than a parish or town council or a neighbourhood forum.

What can a Neighbourhood Plan contain:

So long as your Neighbourhood Plan complies with the above principles, it can be as narrow or as broad as we wish. But it must be primarily about the use and development of land and buildings. It can also have a say in how buildings should look (their design), or the materials they are constructed from.

Typical things that a Neighbourhood Plan might include:

- The development of housing, including affordable housing (affordable housing is housing that is not normally for sale on the open market), and bringing vacant or derelict housing back into use.
- Provision for businesses to set up or expand their premises.
- Transport and access (including issues around roads, cycling, walking and access for disabled people).
- The development of schools, places of worship, health facilities, leisure and entertainment facilities, community and youth centres and village halls.
- The restriction of certain types of development and change of use, for example to avoid too much of one type of use.
- The design of buildings.
- Protection and creation of open space, nature reserves, allotments, sports pitches, play areas, parks and gardens, and the planting of trees.
- Protection of important buildings and historic assets such as archaeological remains.
- Promotion of renewable energy projects, such as solar energy and wind turbines.
- What is the 'Community Right to Build'?
- A Community Right to Build Order, which is the mechanism for delivering the Community Right to Build, is a specific type of Neighbourhood Development Order. It allows a local community group to bring forward a small development, which might include proposals for new homes, business premises and/or community facilities, but it must be small scale in comparison to the size of settlement.

Please, if you have any questions please ask. The driving principals behind the community groups and business groups coming together as they have is to protect the local area, principally to keep it as it is but where appropriate improve it as a place to live and work.

I hope you will be able to resubmit your application and approve the creation of a forum which you could then be part of. The application form for forum membership is found here:

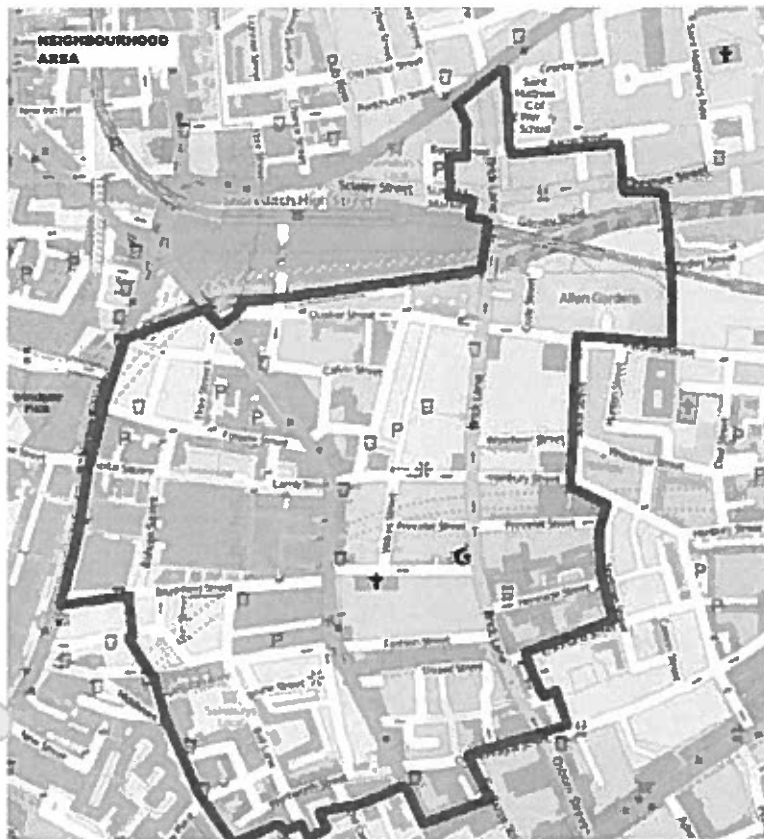

APPENDIX D

SPITALFIELDS NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING FORUM CONSTITUTION

1. NAME

The name of the group is "Spitalfields Neighbourhood Planning Forum" referred to elsewhere in this Constitution as "SNPF".

2. NEIGHBOURHOOD AREA

The area of the SNPF is shown on the attached map (Figure 1), referred to elsewhere in this constitution as the neighbourhood area.

3. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Forum shall be to:

- a) Promote and improve the social, economic and environmental well being of the Neighbourhood area.
- b) To prepare in partnership with the relevant local planning authority a sustainable Neighbourhood Development Plan for the Neighbourhood area.
- c) To encourage the goodwill and involvement of the wider community in the preparation, production and implementation of the Neighbourhood Development Plan;
- d) To foster community spirit and encourage civic pride.

4. POWERS

In furtherance of the objects, but not otherwise, the Committee of the SNPF may exercise the power to:

- a) Invite and receive contributions and raise funds where appropriate, to finance the work of the SNPF, and to open a bank account to manage such funds
- b) Set up working groups with terms of reference to undertake tasks in furtherance of its objectives. All such working groups must include at least one Committee member.
- c) Publicise and promote the work of the SNPF and organise meetings, training courses, events or seminars relevant to its work.
- d) Work with groups of a similar nature and exchange information, advice and knowledge with them, including cooperation with other voluntary bodies, charities, statutory and non- statutory organisations.
- e) Employ a Clerk and other staff (who shall not be members of the Committee) as are necessary to conduct activities that meet the objectives of the SNPF.
- f) Take any form of action that is lawful, which is necessary to achieve the objectives of the SNPF, including taking out any contracts which it may see fit.

5. AFFILIATIONS

The Forum shall not be affiliated to any political party or organisation.

6. MEMBERSHIP

- a) Members will apply for membership and the Committee shall have the power to accept members. Members of the Forum must be over 18 (eighteen) years of age,
- b) The Committee may refuse membership, or may terminate or suspend the membership of any member by resolution passed at a Committee meeting where it is considered membership would be detrimental to the objectives and activities of the SNPF.
- c) Membership is open to all who live in the neighbourhood area (see 2. Above).
- d) Membership is open to all business operators in the neighbourhood area of the SNPF – Business operators may nominate up to two people in their membership application but they may only exercise one voting right at General and Annual General Meetings of the SNPF.
- e) Membership is open to all constituted voluntary and community groups which operate in the neighbourhood area. Voluntary and Community groups may nominate up to two people in their membership application but they may only exercise one voting right at General and Annual General Meetings of the SNPF.
- f) Membership is open to elected London Borough Council members who represent wards in the neighbourhood area.
- g) Membership shall be drawn from different places in the neighbourhood area and different sections of the community.
- h) Any member of the SNPF may resign from membership by providing the Secretary with written notice.
- i) The SNPF shall have a minimum of 21 (twenty one) members. The Secretary shall maintain a register of members at all times and make it available to any member of the SNPF or the public who requests it.

7. FORUM MEETING

All decisions at Forum meetings shall be made on a show of hands of members who are entitled to vote at the meeting.

- a) General Meetings
 - i. General Meetings of SNPF members shall take place at least 3 (three) times per year.
 - ii. Notice and an agenda for a General Meeting of the SNPF to SNPF members shall be 10 (ten) working days.
 - iii. The quorum required for a General Meeting to conduct business shall be 11 (eleven) SNPF members
- b) Annual General Meetings/Special Meetings
 - i. An Annual General Meeting of SNPF members shall take place once in every calendar year. Notice and an agenda for an Annual General Meeting to SNPF members shall be 15 (fifteen) working days.
 - ii. The quorum required for an Annual General Meeting to conduct business shall be 15 (fifteen) SNPF Members

The Annual General meeting shall:

- iii. Elect the Committee of the SNPF
- iv. Receive a report from the Committee of the SNPF of the activities that have taken place in the year
- v. Receive a final statement from the Treasurer

Elections to the Committee shall take place as follows:

- vi. SNPF members shall notify the Secretary of the SNPF of their intention to stand for a place on the Committee in writing and at least 5 (five) working days before the Annual General Meeting takes place.
- vii. At the Annual General Meeting elections shall be held on the basis of a show of hands for each candidate.

c) Special Meetings may be called from time to time by the Committee to consider amendments to the constitution or dissolution of the Forum. These shall be subject to the same notice and quorum as Annual General Meetings.

d) Committee Meetings

- i. Committee meetings will be held a minimum of 6 times per year.
- ii. Notice to members of the Committee of a Committee meeting shall be 7 working days
- iii. The quorum required for a Committee meeting to conduct business shall be 7 (seven) members.
- iv. Two officers of the Committee must be present at each meeting of the Committee. One of which must be either the Chairman or the Vice Chairman.
- v. All decisions at Committee meetings shall be made on a show of hands of Committee members present at the meeting.
- vi. The Officers of the Committee shall be elected by the Members of the Committee at the first meeting of the Committee after the AGM of the SNPF.
- vii. To avoid the possibility of the SNPF becoming dominated by members of another organisation no more than three members of the Committee may at any time be drawn from the forum membership category for business and no more than three may be drawn from the forum membership category for voluntary and community groups (see clause 6d and 6e).
- viii. Should any officer or member of the Committee fail to attend more than three consecutive meetings of the Committee then their membership of the Committee shall be deemed to have lapsed. A temporary replacement for any such lapsed member may be selected by the Committee from the membership of the SNPF who will then take the lapsed member's place on the Committee until the next AGM. In such cases where an Officer position becomes vacant then their replacement shall be found from among the pre-existing members of the Committee.
- ix. During Committee meetings any Committee member having a personal or business interest in any decision of the Committee must declare that interest and the Committee shall have the discretion to exclude that member from that decision.

8. COMMITTEE

The Committee of the SNPF shall be elected at an Annual General Meeting of the SNPF and shall consist of a minimum of 9 (nine) members up to a maximum of 13 (thirteen).

9. OFFICERS OF THE COMMITTEE

The role of any officer of the Committee may be shared by two members of the Committee.

- a) The Chairman of the Committee shall be responsible for:
 - i. Calling and chairing meetings of the Committee of the SNPF, General Meetings and Annual General Meetings of the membership of the SNPF, unless specifically delegated to the Vice Chairman in writing.
 - ii. Exercising a casting vote on elections and resolutions at meetings of the Forum and its Committee.
 - iii. Have the power to take decisions on urgent matters between meetings of the Committee
 - iv. The holder of the office of Chairman shall also be entitled to use the title and style "Honorary Headborough of the Parish and Hamlet of Spitalfields". This is a heritage title of long standing in Spitalfields that symbolically connects SNPF with past representative bodies.
 - v. The title and office of Chairman is synonymous to and interchangeable with that of Chairwoman.
- b) The Vice Chairman of the Committee shall be responsible for:
 - i. Calling and chairing meetings of the Committee of the SNPF, General Meetings and Annual General Meetings of the membership of the SNPF, if specifically delegated to by the Chairman in writing.
 - ii. Exercising a casting vote on elections and resolutions at meetings of the Forum and its Committee where the Chairman is absent in accordance with rule 9(a)i.
 - iii. The title and office of Vice Chairman is synonymous to and interchangeable with that of Vice Chairwoman.
- c) The Treasurer shall be responsible for:
 - i. Maintaining the financial records of the SNPF.
 - ii. Be responsible for presenting the accounts for the year, and a budget for the following year at the SNPF Annual General Meeting.
 - iii. Submit a detailed summary of the accounts at every Committee meeting.
 - iv. Act as a joint signatory on the SNPF account with one other member of the Committee.
 - v. Taking the minutes if the Secretary is absent.
- d) The Secretary shall be responsible for:
 - i. Organizing meetings, taking and circulating the minutes and making them available to members within 10 (ten) working days of the previous meeting.
 - ii. Maintaining a register of members of the SNPF and the SNPF Constitution for inspection by members of the public and SNPF Members.

10. THE FINANCES OF THE SNPF

- a) Any money acquired by the SNPF, including donations, contributions and bequests, shall be paid into an account operated by the Committee in the name of the SNPF.
- b) All funds must be applied to the objectives of the SNPF and for no other purpose.
- c) Bank accounts shall be opened in the name of the Forum. Any deeds, cheques etc relating to the Forum's bank account shall be signed by at least 2 (two) Committee members, 1 (one) of whom must be the Treasurer
- d) Any income/expenditure shall be the responsibility of the Treasurer who will be accountable to ensure funds are utilised effectively and that the Forum stays within its budget.
- e) Official accounts shall be maintained, and will be examined annually by an independent accountant who is not a member of the Forum.
- F) An annual financial report shall be presented by the Treasurer at the Annual General Meeting of the SNPF.

11. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING

- a) Any decision to submit to the local planning authority for approval any Neighbourhood Development Plan shall be subject to a vote at a General Meeting of the SNPF.
- b) All consultation on the Neighbourhood Development Plan will take place with residents and businesses in the neighbourhood area whether members of the SNPF or not.
- c) The Committee shall be delegated to work with the local planning authority and any independent experts and advisors on the Neighbourhood Development Plan as they see fit.
- d) At the discretion of the SNPF Committee working groups can be delegated the tasks of preparing the Neighbourhood Development Plan and may co-opt non-voting members onto such working groups as it sees fit. All such working groups must include at least one Committee member.

12. ALTERATION OF THE CONSTITUTION

- a) Any changes to this constitution must be agreed by a majority vote at an AGM or at a special general meeting, called specifically for the purpose under the same conditions that apply to Annual General Meetings specified above.
- b) Proposed amendments to this Constitution or dissolution of the SNPF must be conveyed to the Secretary formally in writing. The Secretary and other officers of the SNPF shall then decide whether to put the proposed amendments to a special general meeting of the SNPF for discussion and decision.

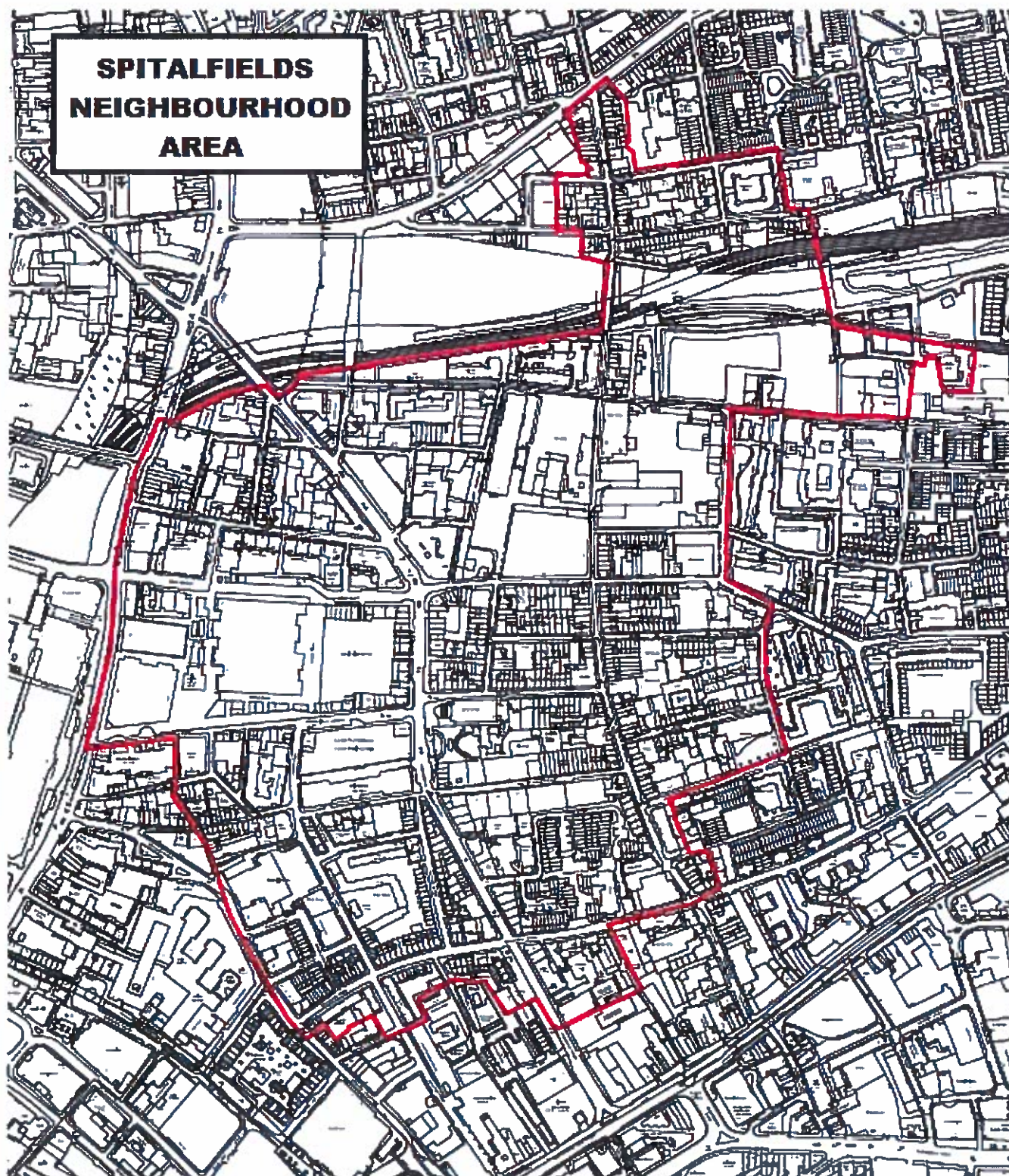
13. DISSOLUTION

The SNPF may be dissolved if deemed necessary by the members in a majority vote at a special meeting. Any assets or remaining funds after debts have been paid shall be returned to their providers or transferred to local charities or similar groups at the discretion of the Committee.

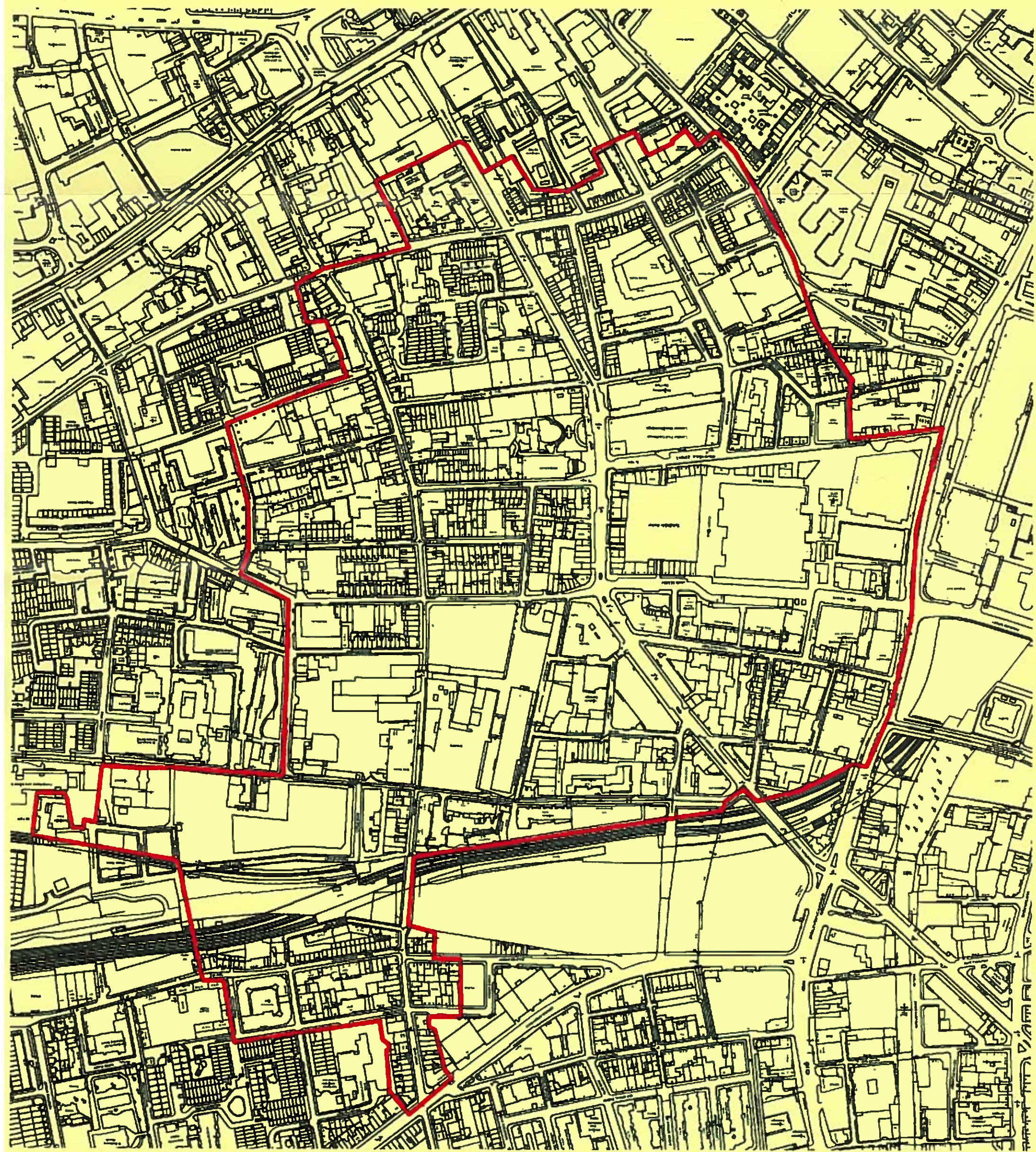

WHAT IS THE SPITALFIELDS NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING FORUM?

Under the new Localism Act, communities like ours are encouraged to set up neighbourhood planning forums. Amenity groups, residents' organisations, local associations and individuals in Spitalfields have already come together to consider plans to establish a Spitalfields Neighbourhood Planning Forum, covering broadly the Brick Lane and Commercial Street areas.
